Rachel Page Elliott has long been one of America's most respected authorities on dog gait. Her studies using cineradiography (motion-picture X-ray) equipment at Harvard University's Museum of Comparative Zoology provide new insights on bone and joint motion in canines. In 1998, the AKC awarded her their Lifetime Achievement Award in the field of conformation -- the first woman to be so honored. She authored "DogSteps" and, with the AKC, produced a film on canine movement.
